



**‘Structured observation’** is a method whereby conditions or key behaviours or are observed using well-designed observation record forms.

- Structured observations are easy to perform and can generally be implemented rapidly and unobtrusively.
- The observation record form should list the items to be observed and provide spaces to record observations. These forms are similar to survey questionnaires, but investigators record their own observations, not respondents' answers.
- Observation record forms help standardize the observation process and ensure that all important items are covered.
- They also facilitate better aggregation of data gathered from various sites (e.g. households, villages) or by various investigators.
