IFB: DESIGN & BUILD OF THE NURSES MULTIPURPOSE TRAINING CENTRE

1. The Government of New Zealand has provided towards the Nurses Multipurpose Training Centre, as part of the commemoration of the 1918 Influenza Epidemic and a hundred (100) years of Nursing Services in Samoa. In line with the Government of Samoa's priority on placing the focus back on Public Health/Population Health, the Training Centre will provide for multi-disciplinary training programs, a refuge for evacuation purposes and other functional requirements of the Samoa Nurses Association (SNA).
2. In partnership with the Ministry of Health (MOH), the project is in line with the overarching objectives of the MOH contractual arrangements. Those being to improve access to, and utilization of effective, efficient and quality health services to improve the health status of Samoa's population in line with the Health Sector Plan vision of a "*A Healthy Samoa*".
3. A contractor will be selected using the Competitive Bidding procedures as described in the Bidding documents, in accordance with Government of Samoa Procurement Guidelines.
4. Interested eligible bidders may obtain the Bidding documents from the Ministry of Health through request to emails listed below.
5. A pre-bid meeting will be held on Wednesday January 31, 2024 at 10.00am at the MOH headquarter conference room 2.
6. All bids must be accompanied by a Bid Securing Declaration using for that purpose the form included in the bidding documents.
